Sub-theme	Building an inclusive and knowledge-driven industrialization for Africa
Objectives and outcomes	This consultative meeting is intended to address the following issues:
	 Provide a platform for alignment and harmonization of capacity, approaches, and policies to design and implement effective industrialization actions within the context of Agenda 2063;
	 Help to translate continental and regional Industrialisation objectives into measurable targets through the establishment of a community of practice;
	 Jointly explore 'new' thinking on the necessary Africa industrialization pathways, considering the diversity across Africa's 55 member states), as well as implications of the ongoing COVID19 pandemic for Africa's Industrialisation;
	 Bridge existing gaps of knowledge and science, including information and communications technology (ICT) necessary for the industrialization development process; and identify opportunities for member states to leapfrog participation into the 4th industrial revolution;
	Contribute to AU momentum to champion renewed focus on Africa- Industrialisation among key stakeholders in the political, technical, private and research sectors to ensure complementary with the AfCFTA momentum.
	 This meeting is intended to result in the following outcomes: Identification of existing issues and opportunities for Africa's Industrialisation to help to frame research priorities for evidence-based guidance and support; Identification of opportunities for partnership to implement the AUDA-NEPAD programme on Industrialisation; Agreement on options for input into the discussions on the African Union
	 Summit on Industrialisation in 2021; and Agreement on innovative mechanisms to reinforce collaboration and enhance integration and alignment in programming and implementation support among diverse players in Africa's Industrialisation ecosystem.
Background and Rationale	The rapid progress towards the realization of the African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA), has catalyzed the imperative to advance expansion in the continent's industrial capacity. The interdependences between industrialisation and the AfCFTA is a critical success factor for Africa's economic growth and development for the attainment of Agenda 2063's First Ten-Year Implementation Plan).
	Recognizing the significant contributions of think tanks and research institutions to interrogating Africa's development processes, strengthening leadership capacities, and advancing critical thinking and evidence-informed practices and innovation towards the

	continent's economic integration ambitions and goals, AUDA-NEPAD places great importance on this particular engagement in building and fostering the AU's development agenda. The consultative meeting will be a key step in the process towards building a strong and coherent community of practice to advance an inclusive and resilient framework for Africa's Industrialisation.
Meeting Format	 The methodology of the webinar will include two targeted sessions: Panel Discussion to build a community of practice to advance Africa's industrialization to provide an enabling environment for the consolidation and harmonization of multi-stakeholder efforts; Plenary discussion to identify innovative mechanisms to strengthen collaboration and enhance integration and alignment in programming and implementation support within Africa's Industrialisation ecosystem
	The discussions are expected to contribute to advancing Africa's resolve and determination on Industrialisation by fostering knowledge-enriched industrialization through stronger collaborative partnerships with Think Tanks and Research institutions. Participants will be encouraged to discuss options to create an enabling environment for the consolidation and harmonization of multi-stakeholder efforts to advance Africa's industrialization and to prioritize actions to inform priority continental and regional processes such as the AU Summit on Industrialization to be held in 2021.
