# Best Practice Guidelines

## Definition

A “best practice” is defined as a practice, technique or method that has proven to work well and produced good results and is therefore recommended as a model or benchmark.

## Principles

- Provides a method or technique that has consistently shown good results compared with those achieved with other means;
- Provides a set of guidelines, ethics or ideas that represent the most efficient course of action;
- Is usually evidence-based and hence can be used as a benchmark;
- Can evolve to become better as improvements are discovered;
- Can be used to maintain high quality and efficiency.

## Criteria

Identifying best practices involves judgement, which requires prior analysis using the following set of criteria: effectiveness, efficiency, relevance, ethical soundness, sustainability, denoting a high possibility of replication and upscaling, and with strong interest – promising the involvement of partners, the community and securing political commitment (Table 1). By definition, a best practice should meet at least the **effectiveness, efficiency, relevance, ethical soundness, and possibility of replication criteria**, in addition to a few other criteria highlighted in table 1 below.

**Table 1. Best Practice Criteria**

<b>Criterion</b>	<b>Description</b>
<b>Effectiveness</b>	This is a fundamental criterion implicit in the definition. The practice must work and achieve results that are measurable
<b>Efficiency</b>	The proposed practice must produce results with a reasonable level of resources and time
<b>Relevance</b>	The proposed practice must address the priority areas of current or potential users
<b>Ethical soundness</b>	The practice must respect the current rules of ethics for dealing with related socio-economic and people-centred development dynamics
<b>Sustainability</b>	The proposed practice, as carried out, must be implementable over a long period with the use of existing resources
<b>Possibility of replication</b>	The proposed practice, as carried out, must be replicable elsewhere in the Member State or region or continent
<b>Involvement of partnerships</b>	The proposed practice must involve satisfactory collaboration between several stakeholders
<b>Community involvement</b>	The proposed practice must involve the participation of the affected communities
<b>Political commitment</b>	The proposed practice must have support from the relevant national or local authorities

**Table 2. Attributes of Best Practices**

<b>Criterion</b>	<b>Description</b>
<b>Credibility</b>	Documented, sound evidence/results that can be advocated by respected persons or institutions
<b>Observability</b>	Potential users can see the results in practice, e.g. pilot/experimental or demonstration sites
<b>Relevance</b>	Addresses a persistent or serious problem or policy priority
<b>Relative advantage</b>	New practice offers a benefit over existing practices so that potential users are convinced that the costs of implementation are outweighed by the benefits
<b>Easy to install and understand</b>	Process of scaling up the practice is not complex and complicated, but rather simple
<b>Compatibility</b>	The practice fits well with the practices of the national programme and with the potential users' established values, norms and facilities
<b>Testability</b>	The practice can be tried out incrementally on a small pilot scale before large-scale adoption

**Table 3. Outline for Documenting Best Practices**

Item	Description
<b>Title of the best practice</b>	Catchy and easy-to-understand the description of the practice
<b>Brief description</b>	<p>This should provide the context of and justification for the practice, and address the following issues:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• What was the problem that needed to be addressed?</li> <li>• Where was the best practice implemented?</li> <li>• Which population was affected, and where?</li> <li>• What was the practice set out to do?</li> <li>• What results were achieved?</li> </ul>
<b>Detailed description</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• What is the problem being addressed?</li> <li>• Which population is being affected?</li> <li>• How did the problem impact the population?</li> <li>• What were the objectives and targets of implementing the best practice?</li> </ul>
<b>Implementation of the practice</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• What were the main activities carried out?</li> <li>• When and where were the activities carried out?</li> <li>• Who were the key implementers and collaborators?</li> <li>• What resources were used?</li> </ul>
<b>Results of the practice to date – Outputs and Outcomes</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• What were the concrete results achieved with regard to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A) outputs (immediate) and</li> <li>• B) outcomes (changes in target population’s practices)?</li> </ul> </li> <li>•</li> </ul>
<b>Lessons learnt and success factors</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Was an in-depth review, assessment or evaluation of the practice carried out? If yes:</li> <li>• What worked really well – and what facilitated this?</li> <li>• What did not work – why did it not work?</li> <li>• What could have been done better or differently?</li> <li>•</li> </ul>
<b>Innovation and Adaptation</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• What are the 3 to 5 key features of the practice that make it stand-out as a best practice?</li> <li>• How has the practice contributed to innovations in the thematic or geographical area of operation?</li> <li>• To what extent is the target population embracing and assimilating the new practice – as an innovation in its socio-economic development pursuit?</li> </ul>

**Recommendations**

- What are the key considerations if the practice is to be replicated elsewhere successfully?
- What are the conditions (institutional, economic, social, and environmental) that need to be in place for the good practice to be successfully replicated (in a similar context)?
